Goal : Student health and safety will be improved as a result of a comprehensive prevention strategy that addresses behaviors in and out of school.	 District will host a Health and Wellness Expo to showcase contemporary health and wellness topics. Expand and enhance our Concussion Management program by providing additional workshops and sessions for community members. Establish task force to review a research-based antibullying programs and review Character Ed and anti- bullying curriculum currently in use district-wide. Implementation safety reporting system that is simple, secure and enables students to quickly report incidents related to bullying, cyberbullying, student depression, family problems, self-harm, drugs, gang-related issues, harassment, weapons on campus or unusual student behavior which may warrant immediate attention by school officials. 	 The SOCSD Public Relations Team will sponsor a Health and Wellness Expo in the Spring 2016 with representation from health, wellness, prevention, and other human services agencies. An exit survey will be administered after the event to determine community awareness and use of these resources. The frequency of Concussion Management training and education events will increase. The Assistant Superintendent and Leadership Team will establish a task force to better understand the nature of student health and safety risks in the district and determine appropriate solutions and prevention measures. The task force will be established in January 2017 and will meet regularly thereafter. The Prevention and Safety Task Force will review and analyze a safety reporting system for field implementation in the Spring 2017.
